

"I'm a Duluth Central grad, and I went to get my real estate license right after I graduated in 2011. I've been selling real estate ever since. And I wanted to add an investment to my portfolio that is fun and something I felt contributed to making Duluth a better place.

"We opened in January of 2020, and we felt this concept was great for Lincoln Park," he said, "because you can try all of the different local beers, ciders and seltzers and bring in any food of your choice to accompany the space's environment and ambiance."

The Duluth Tap Exchange offers 40 self-pour taps and a full bar. "This gives our patrons complete control in the selection of what they choose and how much "It's been a fun and wild ride. We hope someday we can bring they would like," DeCaro said. "You can try an ounce of each tap, or you can enjoy the same tap. We also taproom. have a full bar for any spirit of choice, if you're not feeling beer or cider.

"The Duluth Tap Exchange has seven to 10 team members at any given time, and our demographic is pretty wide," he added. "Our goals are to continue to the Northland as well."

hen I started, I did not think this would become my career," said Zachary Tharge, owner of Detail & Dash, the mobile car detailing business that provides services right on its customers' sites. Tharge, a lifelong Superiorite who graduated from Superior High School in 2017, originally meant to be a nurse. "Over time, as I started doing more vehicles, it evolved into more of a business and not just a side job," he explained.

Tharge launched the business in 2018 "with \$100 worth of equipment from Walmart," he said. "At the time, I drove a Chevy Impala and used the trunk to haul the detailing equipment around. I didn't have any prior training in detailing, but I decided to give it a shot, I started by detailing the vehicles of friends and family, and then I would do occasional vehicles of people they knew."

Before long, Tharge was attracting new clients through social media and constantly building his business by reinvesting his profits. Growth has happened quickly. "It used to only be me that was doing the detailing. But this year, at our busiest time, I had nine employees and three mobile units up and running," he noted. Detail & Dash offers cleaning and other services in addition to detailing, and it serves customers within a 50-mile service radius of the Twin Ports area. It also provides the option of staff picking up customer vehicles to work on them at its shop.
